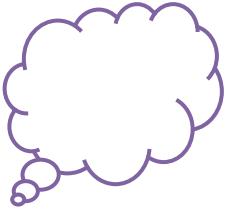
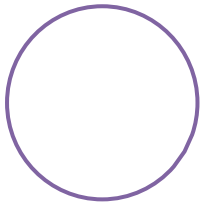


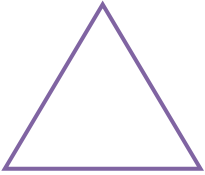
# Homework 1 -

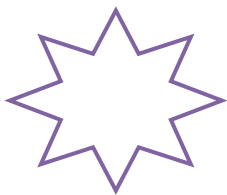
Use a computer, describe or talk to your child's teacher about other ways to record their homework. You can also help your child prepare for their homework by asking them to draw it first.

Print borders or charts etc onto plain paper. You can find lots of resources on the internet for maths and literacy. Go with your child's subject choice even if it seems silly. Try and link things to your child's own experience.



Use the timings from school as a guide and do what's right for you and your child. Talk to your child's teacher if homework is taking too long. Don't worry if it feels short as long as they have made an effort to do what they can.

Remember to reward and praise your child's efforts.
